Summer is nearly over, and Fall is almost upon us. Our seasonal residents are heading home, and our children and grandchildren are heading back to school. Please take some time to prepare for the colder temperatures. Cover your boats, treat your small gas engines, and insulate where you can. And finally, please keep in mind that our smaller, furry friends may be looking for somewhere to spend the winter and warm/dry locations are often preferred, especially if food might be available.

The Chippewa County Road Commission's (CCRC's) continues to work on Village Road. If progress is achieved according to the plan, this road work will be completed by Thanksgiving. Between now and then, if you happen to be traveling in that direction, please drive carefully. Thus far, work on that road has been extraordinary, so please don't get in their way.

For those wondering about the CCRC's efforts to mow the grass on the shoulders of Sugar Island roads, the mower was damaged while they were here last month, Unfortunately the equipment had to be returned to the mainland for repair. It is scheduled to return to the Island when the mower is repaired, which could be any day.

The work on the North Westshore Park continues with clearing brush, trees, and removing stumps as well as the installation of a beautiful, new playground set. This could be done by the end of this year. The playground adjacent to the Community Center is also progressing. Special thanks to those that have provided volunteer support to these efforts.

And finally, the Township continues to look for a skilled community planner to join our Township Planning Commission. The current version of our zoning document is in serious need of updating. Updating these types of documents is difficult and time-consuming work. If you have time, are a qualified elector, have some measure of computer literacy, and are willing to put forth the effort, we will be spending a serious effort in the next four or five years updating our zoning ordinances. Notice: The legal responsibility is on the property owner for paying on the correct parcel of property. The property owner must be responsible for payment on the correct descriptions. The sum stated is for taxes assessed upon the described property.

It is very important that you review your tax bill to be positive you are receiving a PRE exemption, if you qualify. This was formally known as "Homestead Exemption". It is located on the bottom half of the left side of you tax bill. If you qualify, it should read 100% in the PRE box. <u>Check:</u> (as conditional payment only, until the check has cleared the bank) Please mail early- it may take the postal service 2 to 3 weeks to deliver your check. Any check not received by 02/29/2023 will be considered late and be returned to sender. Postmark is <u>NOT</u> considered a payment date.

HISTORIC HOLY ANGELS CHURCH

Holy Angels Church was built under the direction of Bishop Baraga circa 1856-57 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Holy Angels is located at 10158 E Northshore Drive in the historic Payment area of Sugar Island.

Efforts of the Holy Angels Restoration Committee resulted in raising enough funds to replace the broken and sagging foundation, repair windows, and have the exterior professionally painted. The Committee continues to make improvements and repairs to the church so everyone can come in and absorb its beautiful history and presence of Venerable Bishop Frederic Baraga.




