MESSAGE FROM THE ASSESSOR:

Your Sugar Island Assessor will be conducting fieldwork during the coming summer and fall months. The State of Michigan would like Assessors to visit 20% of township parcels each year to make sure the property records are accurate. Many owners of property neglect to let the assessor know when they remove a building or when a building collapses under the weight of the snow. It makes a difference in your taxes for the following year. Your property record card is available for your inspection at your request. Just give me a call or an email.

Watch for either our red or black jeep with the "Township Assessor" signs and the orange light on the top. We will knock on your door to let you know we are on your property but will never ask to come in. We may only want to measure and take new pictures of your buildings or property for the assessment roll.

I am usually in the office at the township hall on Tuesday's from 10:00 until 1:00. If you need to meet with me at a different time, just let me know and we can set up a time. I am available in my home office 7 days a week at any time - just call.

Sugar Island Township News

Summer is here and many of our residents are looking forward to planting flowers and other yard work. The Township is working to assist in this effort. This support includes the opening of the South Transfer Station in mid-May. We will also be making open-top dumpsters available every weekend, starting June 3-4 and ending September 30-October 1, 2023. Two dumpsters will be available every weekend, subject to maintenance and transportation capabilities. Please do not dispose of prohibited items such as tires, fluids of any kind, organic yard refuse, building materials and hazardous materials. These dumpsters are not to be used by contractors nor do we want people bringing trash from the mainland. We will also look to continue our metal recycling program with an open top container available throughout the summer.

A special "shout out" goes to Mindy Fox from Northern Transitions Incorporated. We no longer are required to pay the ferry fare for taking the recycling trailer to the mainland. This change moves our recycling program closer to overall solvency. Please keep in mind that we pay for the solid waste compactors by weight. We pay for the open tops with a flat fee. With the recycling trailer, we pay each time we bring the materials collected in the recycling trailer to the mainland. Our metal, open top container, recycling program does provide us with some limited revenues to offset some of the expenses associated with the other recycling trailers costs.

"At the recycling center we take Glass, Tin/Aluminum, all Plastics, Shred, and Paper. All items MUST be clean. We do not take cardboard in the trailers, but there is a cardboard trailer at the transfer station for this reason. Cardboard is anything that is brown, like beer/pop boxes, tissue boxes, cereal box, brown paper bags, etc. "

Our road work program will be continuing this year with efforts to complete lifting, ditching, and resurfacing of Village Road. We expect this work to be completed this fall. If or when the Township has the resources and decides to pave Village Road, that effort will be delayed until 2024 or beyond. The guardrails were also reinstalled last month at the road across the stream crossing on Haypoint Road. Additionally, the debris and vegetation will be removed from the guardrails on North Eastshore Drive. And then finally, the Township approved the contracting of a company to treat 22 miles of gravel roads on the Island. The treatment is scheduled for a couple of weeks before Independence Day. This timing might be delayed a week or two if the ground is saturated.

On a related topic, the Township Board has voted to offer a renewal of three separate millage initiatives later this year. The three ballots cover the fire department, the ambulance department, and the road fund. All three millages serve to maintain programs at the current rates. The fire department millage is for two years. The ambulance department millage is also for two years. The road fund millage is for eight years.

And finally, the Township now has a vacancy on the Planning Commission and on the Zoning Board of Appeals due to the recent resignation of Kathy Cairns. We thank her for her years of service to Sugar Island. She will be missed. Candidates interested in filling these two vacancies must submit a letter of interest with their qualifications to the Township Clerk. We know there are lots of educated, diverse, experienced, and devoted Sugar Island voters capable of doing this work. Please help us.



HISTORIC HOLY ANGELS CHURCH

Holy Angels Church was built under the direction of Bishop Baraga circa 1856-57 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Holy Angels is located at 10158 E Northshore Drive in the historic Payment area of Sugar Island.

Efforts of the Holy Angels Restoration Committee resulted in raising enough funds to replace the broken and sagging foundation, repair windows, and have the exterior professionally painted. The Committee continues to make improvements and repairs to the church so everyone can come in and absorb its beautiful history and presence of Venerable Bishop Frederic Baraga.
