FIRE PLUGS

Your fire department had a busy month even with low fire danger keeping up with maintenance and training. It is the time of year when we put away our winter equipment. The skies have come off the rescue sled and wheels are on and the mini tanker is now filled and ready for grass fires.

While our chief was attending a meeting of the UP Fire Chiefs Association another group traveled to the Smithers Testing Facility near Raco. There were doughnuts and really good coffee and for lunch pulled pork and chicken with baked beans and macaroni and cheese. Sometime during this eating orgy there was time for Cloverland Electric to put on a demonstration about electric line safety and for training on electric vehicle fires by the EUP Fire Fighters Association.

Electric vehicles are becoming more common and they bring their own set of challenges for the fire department when things go wrong. And while we think about just electric cars much of the information also applies to almost anything that has a lithium-ion battery. We share what we learn at these meetings and update our plans to deal with these new challenges. If anyone on the island has an electric car we would like to know as there are specific rules on what to do in case of an emergency. Perhaps we can arrange to have you visit one of our meetings so we can review procedures. Promise not to do any cutting and who knows you may be so excited that you may want to join up.

Sugar Island Township News

Spring is here and the snow is nearly gone. The Township is gearing up for summer activities. We know our seasonal residents will soon be here too, so there is much to prepare for.

The Township approved a summer solid waste program. This program includes the opening of the South Transfer Station in mid-May. We will also be making open-top dumpsters available in the June-September timeframe. More specifically, these open-top dumpsters will be available every weekend, starting June 3-4 and ending September 30-October 1, 2023. These dumpsters will be available, subject to maintenance and transportation capabilities. Please do not dispose of prohibited items such as tires, fluids, building materials and hazardous materials. We will also look to continue our metal recycling program with an open top container available throughout the summer.

For those concerned about such things, our solid waste program is relatively expensive. Our trailer recycling program is a net loser, but it is less expensive than disposing those recyclable items in the compactor. We pay for the compactor by weight. We pay for the open tops with a flat fee, and we pay each time we bring the materials collected in the recycling trailer to the mainland. Our metal, open top container, recycling program does provide us with some limited revenues to offset some of the expenses associated with the other recycling trailers costs.

A special shout-out goes to Amber Horner and her team for their North Park playground equipment replacement efforts. Their fund-raising efforts are truly remarkable. If everything works as it should, we could have new playground equipment by the end of the summer this year. We also want to recognize the individuals and vendors that have donated time and treasure.

Our road work program will be continuing this year with efforts to complete lifting, ditching, and resurfacing of Village Road. We expect this work to be completed this fall. If or when the Township has the resources and decides to pave Village Road, that effort will be delayed until 2024 or beyond.

On a related topic, the Township Board has voted to offer a renewal of three separate millage initiatives later this year. The three ballots cover the fire department, the ambulance department, and the road fund. All three millages serve to maintain programs at the current rates. The fire department millage is for two years. The ambulance department millage is also for two years. The road fund millage is for eight years.

And finally, the Township has agreed to contract with the Eastern Upper Peninsula Regional Planning and Development Commission to update our Township's Master Plan. This update will enhance the Township's ability to apply for and receive state and federal grants, especially as it relates to rural development (i.e., broadband, roads, street lighting, waste management, etc.).

HISTORIC HOLY ANGELS CHURCH

Holy Angels Church was built under the direction of Bishop Baraga circa 1856-57 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Holy Angels is located at 10158 E Northshore Drive in the historic Payment area of Sugar Island.

Efforts of the Holy Angels Restoration Committee resulted in raising enough funds to replace the broken and sagging foundation, repair windows, and have the exterior professionally painted. The Committee continues to make improvements and repairs to the church so everyone can come in and absorb its beautiful history and presence of Venerable Bishop Frederic Baraga.
