FIRE PLUGS

Congratulations to Cole Biron for completing and passing his Fire Fighter training class. Make sure to thank him. He has been a welcome addition to our department.

But training never ends. In May we had a CPR class and practiced fire tactics. Since we often work with other departments, we also will be having joint training with the Dafter Department at the LSSU fire tower to practice search and rescue. Later this summer we will also be doing some joint water supply practice with other departments.

We are now working under new agreement with the Sault Fire Ambulance to provide primary coverage for medical calls on Sugar Island. Our ambulance will now operate in a supporting role and will be part of Sugar Island Fire Department. One of our main concerns is what to do if the ferry is unable to operate. We had to put our backup plan into action during recent ferry problems. We had no runs during this time but the various agencies were put on alert and ready to get a patient off the island if needed.

And since we have people of above average intelligence on the island there have been no calls for wild fires out of control. Have had several calls from people asking if burning is allowed. Sugar Island Township News

Summer is here and so are our visitors. Unfortunately, that means more traffic and higher roadway speeds. As you may surmise, more traffic and higher speeds eventually lead to more accidents. Please slow down and reduce the risk of injury and property damage.

Along with an increased number of visitors, especially those with limited experience with fires, we also are likely to encounter more dangerous fires. Please be careful when burning; make sure the risk is reduced; water is readily available; and if one is required, that a permit has been acquired. This last winter was relatively mild which means we should expect drier conditions this summer and greater potential for large-scale fires.

Recently, some residents have posted "No Trespassing" signs near property lines reflecting a veiled attempt to scare or intimidate Township officials from investigating potential code violations. This attempt is generally misinformed as Township officials are legally permitted to investigate alleged code violations, regardless of postings. Please recognize that the Township Assessor, and Code Administrator cannot accurately and fairly perform their jobs without physically visiting properties for the purpose of investigating allegations. If we want our taxes to be fairly assessed, Township officials must be allowed to do their jobs.

And, as it relates to code compliance, please know that large sheds, steel shipping containers, and similar structures require permits. The structures commonly referred to as "Little Houses" are also generally prohibited on Sugar Island. Contact our Code Administrator before you put yourself in an unnecessary, legal quandary.

The Township has contracted with GFL to provide "open top" dumpsters for Island residents. These 30-yard containers should be used just for household debris. These containers should not be used for construction materials, hazardous materials, yard waste, tires, and similar items. These containers will be available for the first two weekends in June, July, August and September. Residents with a large quantity (more than a 5X8 trailer load) should bring their items early on those specific Saturday mornings to ensure there is ample room for your stuff.

The Township continues to work with the Chippewa County Road Commission to improve roads across the Island. At some point soon, we expect to enter into a cost-sharing agreement to pave Village Road next year and to widen and raise Townhall Road from Haypoint to 3 Mile. If things work as they should, Haypoint and Townhall could be the next to be paved.

Additionally, the Township is seeking to find a vendor to treat the County gravel roads on the Island before Independence Day. However, finding a vendor to do the work has been difficult. We will continue to look. If you know of somebody that might have the capacity to perform this work, please let us know.

And finally, as you may know, every Township Board position (Supervisor, Clerk, Treasurer and two Trustees) will be subject to election this November. The current Supervisor, Clerk and Treasurer are running for re-election, while the two current Trustees are not. If you are eligible, please consider running for local office. The Township benefits when quality people serve in these positions.
