Sugar Island Memorial Service Thursday, August 29 7:00pm



Sugar Island Township News

Summer is here and so are our visitors. Unfortunately, that means more traffic and higher roadway speeds. As you may surmise, more traffic and higher speeds eventually lead to more accidents. Please slow down and reduce the risk of injury and property damage. Plus, please be courteous when passing slow-moving farm tractors on the roadways as they are also doing the best they can to avoid conflict.

For those that might be affected, you should be aware that Soo Tribe has just passed a Nuisance Code (July 2, 2024) that prohibits the use of burn barrels. If that prohibition affects you, please comply. Interested individuals can visit the Soo Tribe's website for further information.

Recently, some residents have inquired why we are now enforcing code compliance. The fact is, we have been enforcing all along. We do not have a full-time compliance force and the rules and priorities change frequently. The state of Michigan and Chippewa County also has a set of rules that we are obligated to follow. We are not funded by the collection of fines so there is no ulterior motive.

And, as it relates to code compliance, please know that large sheds, steel shipping containers, and similar structures require permits before they are put in place. As a reminder, property owners are responsible to ensure permits are properly acquired. The structures commonly referred to as "Little Houses" are also generally prohibited on Sugar Island. The Township Board has been asked to revisit this prohibition and we intend to do so. Please contact our Code Administrator before you purchase a movable structure for relocation to Sugar Island and put yourself in an unnecessary, legal quandary.

The Township Board does not want to pit neighbors against neighbors. We encourage every Sugar Island resident, regardless of their status, to be good neighbors. Unfortunately, we are often compelled to field complaints because a resident (or group of residents) doesn't like the behavior of a neighbor. We ask that neighbors work together in a spirit of cooperation. If a resident is uncooperative, the Township Board may be compelled to create or modify an ordinance to address the issue, but that process is arduous and time consuming. We would prefer to avoid that process because of one uncooperative resident. Plus, the Township will not ask local law enforcement to intervene unless they have a legal standing to do so per a law, code, or ordinance.

The Township has contracted with GFL to provide "open top" dumpsters for Island residents. These 30-yard containers should be used just for **household debris**. These containers should not be used for construction materials, hazardous materials, yard waste, tires, and similar items. Moving forward, these containers will be available for the **FIRST TWO WEEKENDS** in August and September. Residents with a large quantity (more than a 5X8 trailer load) should bring their items early on those specific Saturday mornings to ensure there is ample room for your stuff.

The Township continues to work with the Chippewa County Road Commission to improve roads across the Island to include paving/grading, filling potholes, cutting grass, and replacing culverts. However, we should be mindful that support to Sugar Island Township is just a small portion of the work the Commission is responsible for, and we aren't always on top of the priority list. We are lucky to have two residents that are employees of the Road Commission, and they do the best they can.

And finally, as you may know, every Township Board position (Supervisor, Clerk, Treasurer and two Trustees) will be subject to election this November. The current Supervisor, Clerk and Treasurer are running for reelection, while the two current Trustees are not. If you are eligible, please consider running for local office. The Township benefits when talented people serve in these positions.

It is very important that you review your tax bill to be positive you are receiving a PRE exemption, if you qualify. This was formally known as "Homestead Exemption". It is located on the bottom half of the left side of your tax bill. If you qualify, it should read 100% in the PRE box. OPEN LETTER TO SUGAR ISLAND ELECTORS.

As we near the 2024 election cycle I'd like to remind our Sugar Island voters that our elected Township government runs for election/re-election every four years. This year, registered voters will be asked to select a Supervisor, a Treasurer, a Clerk, and two Trustees. In this upcoming election, you will be asked to vote for two new Trustees as neither of the current Trustees (Repa & Noble) are running for re-election. Three of us will be running for re-election, including me (Supervisor), our current Clerk (Brittany Behm) and the current Treasurer (Jaci Brown). All three of us are running a Republicans.

Unlike larger Townships, the elected officials on the Sugar Island Township Board must do the work required to manage the detailed, day-to-day activities of Township. These activities require some significant knowledge, skills and abilities that are not common across an electorate. Furthermore, it is even more uncommon to find a group of elected officials willing to do the right thing without agendas, even when it is diametrically opposed to the past practices or the good ole boy network. Brittany, Jaci and I are dedicated to doing the right thing by setting up systems and processes that work to establish and maintain a government that is consistent, equitable, efficient and effective. While we don't always agree, we still get the job done.

As you might imagine, it is difficult to find five people elected by the public that are willing and able to work together as a team. We have such a team now and I hope the new Trustees will be just as cooperative. It would be my preference that we re-elect the whole team but we've been unable to convince Ben and Kathy to run again. I don't blame them because these jobs can be thankless, However, moving forward I'm thankful that Brittany and Jaci are running. The Clerk and Treasurer positions are the most technically difficulty jobs to learn and to perform properly. The Supervisor position can be difficult too if the job is done properly. It is my understanding that I will be running against my predecessor, so you will have a choice. As you consider your vote for Supervisor, ask yourself if the candidate you select is capable of the following tasks:

- 1. Facilitate Board meetings and draft the agenda for each meeting.
- 2. Perform the function of parliamentarian following Robert's Rules of Order during each meeting.
- 3. Possess an operational understanding of state and federal laws as they relate to Township functions and operations.
- 4. Create and manage the \$1.5M budget, to include creating resolutions and amendments.
- 5. Interview and recommend volunteer board members for standing committees in accordance with the law.
- 6. Create and maintain a wide variety of public policy procedures involving everything from purchase orders, creating resolutions, updating Board administrative policies and standard operating procedures.
- 7. Advocate for and represent Sugar Island Township with a reputation that reflects competence, integrity and respect.

And finally, when I campaigned four years ago, I told you that I wasn't a politician. If you voted for me because you were hoping I would change, I'm sorry. However, if you want somebody who'll continue to get things done, I hope you'll consider voting for me. Thank you for your time and consideration.
