FIRE PLUGS

Normally sometime in December or even earlier we put skis on the rescue sled and make sure ice rescue gear is in good shape. This year we did this at our last meeting in January because of our "mild" winter. We look forward to the year we don't have to do this but the cost of shipping the equipment to Florida would be cost prohibitive.

So, we ask everyone to be careful while enjoying winter activities. When on the ice carry some type of equipment in case you or a partner end up in the water. Even ice grips on your boots can be helpful and ice picks are easy to carry and use. A rope with some type of float is great to have and like one person told me you can always use a rope even if you don't have an emergency. Even on land emergencies can occur so extra clothing, some fire starters, snacks and a cell phone are handy to have around. Remember if your cell phone is using a Canadian Tower your 911 call will go to Canada. If your phone is roaming, we suggest you use 906-495-3312 which connects you to the Central Dispatch Center in Kincheloe.

And remember we are always looking for new members. Also, it is the time of year to keep your furnace pipes clear of snow. This backup can cause Carbon Monoxide poisoning. One final thing to put on your chore list is to check on your address sign. Some become blocked in winter. On your mailbox it is nice to have your address on both sides.

Our recycling trailer was involved in an accident in early January that resulted in some debris being spread along the roadside. We fully expect to pick up the spilled debris when it is safe to do so. More importantly, we are thankful that nobody was seriously hurt.

As we have mentioned many times, townships across Michigan are having difficulty recruiting and retaining volunteers. Unfortunately, Sugar Island is no exception. This current situation places an unusual burden on the existing volunteers, the employees, and the elected board members. We are eternally grateful that we have residents willing to volunteer. We will be conducting <u>a joint board</u> meeting at 6:00pm on February 13, 2024 at the Community Center. Additionally, our current Fire Chief (Dave Pine) has just resigned with an effective date of January 31, 2024. He will remain a volunteer firefighter, but his new job won't allow him to spend the necessary time required of the Chief job. We thank him for his dedicated service. Please come to the February 2024 Joint Board Meeting which starts at 6:00pm and be prepared to express your interest.

And finally, to remain transparent, the Treasurer (Jaci Brown) and I will be representing the Township in negotiations with Soo Fire to ensure we can maintain quality emergency medical services moving forward. The purpose of these negotiations is to establish a new relationship with Soo Fire that reduces the burden on our volunteers, and wherever possible, increases the overall quality of emergency medical services to our residents.

Notice: The legal responsibility is on the property owner for paying on the correct parcel of property. The property owner must be responsible for payment on the correct descriptions. The sum stated is for taxes assessed upon the described property.

It is very important that you review your tax bill to be positive you are receiving a PRE exemption, if you qualify. This was formally known as "Homestead Exemption". It is located on the bottom half of the left side of you tax bill. If you qualify, it should read 100% in the PRE box. <u>Check</u>: (as conditional payment only, until the check has cleared the bank) Please mail early- it may take the postal service 2 to 3 weeks to deliver your check. Any check not received by 02/29/2024 will be considered late and be returned to sender. Postmark is not considered a payment date.
