

Peace of Christ be with each and every soul on Sugar Island this New Year!





#### FIRE PLUGS

First your Fire Department wants to wish everyone a Safe and Happy New Year. Second or secondly, let's us just go with also there will be a firefighter training class starting in January. This will be a combination of Zoom meetings at the Island Fire Station and hands on training at the Kinross Fire Station. This is a great opportunity to serve your community. Please contact Dave Pine a 440-8401 for more information. The class starts January 9<sup>th</sup> and the Fire Department provides transportation to the meetings in Kinross.

A safety reminder for the upcoming winter is to be careful if you have to park on the road especially at night. Find some way to mark your vehicle either with a safety cone or flag. There are also battery-operated LED flashers that you can use to mark your car when parking on the side of the road or a breakdown. Got these for my grandson as he apparently missed the driver's ed class about gas stations.

And if you or someone you know enjoys recreation that puts them on the ice a good safety device in addition to ice pics, is a throw bag. This is a bag with an attached rope which can be thrown to a victim in distress. We carry these with our ice rescue gear and they can be easily carried on a sled. The motto is "throw before you go" meaning: before you get too close to a person who has fallen through the ice throw or reach with something so there suddenly isn't two people in the water. These throw bags are easy to use. Plus, if you enjoy playing fetch and don't have a dog you can practice, since the throw bag is attached to the rope you can easily pull it back after you throw it out.

Sugar Island Ferry Update: Effective Immediately: 12/16/2022

In an attempt to accommodate essential services and customers needing to move goods and materials for employment purposes, we will be trying to accommodate requests for moves. If a person needs to make a heavy load or trailer move, they may call the Sugar Islander II Ferry (906) 635-5421 for approval and to schedule the move by appointment. Moves will be scheduled on Off-Peak times as determined by the crew. Weather may be a limiting factor when considering approval for a move. This is not intended for recreational and nonessential moves. We will be reassessing the status the week of December 27, 2022.

Thank you for your understanding and adherence to these limitations.

This has been discussed with the USCG and maintains compliance with our restrictions during this time.

ALL MOVES ARE AT THE RISK OF THE OWNER/OPERATOR. NO DAMAGE CLAIMS WILL BE CONSIDERED BY EUPTA FOR MOVES INVOLVING BACKING UP AND ON OR OFF THE FERRY BOAT. NO EXCEPTIONS.

The Sugar Islander Ferry will be taken out of service for repairs in the very near future, and the DIII will be put in service for the duration of time it takes to repair the Sugar Islander.

off at the Sugar Island Township Community Center.

As the falling snow becomes a daily occurrence, we know that frozen and slippery patches will be a recurring circumstance on our roads. Please be careful, mind your speed, and use your best Judgement when passing or driving into curves. We also know that many of our roads don't have discernable lane markings, especially when snow/ice covered, so it is important that you provide enough space for oncoming traffic to move without leaving the road. It might cause a few more minutes of travel time but that extra measure of caution you exercise by slowing down can save your life and the life of others.

On other news, the Township is experiencing an increasing number of zoning compliance violations. The development and maintenance of the zoning code's language is the responsibility of the Zoning Board, which is generally independent of the Township's Board of Trustees. The codes are posted on the Township's website (sugarislandtownship.org/services/services-5/). When these codes are violated, and an apparent violation is reported, the Township's code administrator has an obligation to investigate and then site the appropriate property owners, which comes with a \$60 fee for the permit application and a \$500 penalty fee. If a property owner wishes to appeal a compliance decision, they can request the opportunity to address the Zoning Board of Appeals. Those

requests should be in writing and addressed to "Chair, Zoning Board of Appeals" and dropped

So, to avoid problems, Sugar Island property owners should submit zoning compliance applications well before they modify, or add to an existing porch or structure; add to or modify any existing structure; add any new structure, or otherwise add value to their property. Questions regarding zoning compliance should be directed to our zoning code compliance administrator (Burt Menard) at 1-906-635-5105. Please be aware that nothing in these two paragraphs replace or otherwise supersedes specific language in the approved Zoning Code.

As you may know, the Township's fiscal year ends on March 31<sup>th</sup> which means we will be working on our budget in the upcoming months. If you and your friends are interested in changing millage rates, or spending priorities, please feel free to present those ideas at our regularly scheduled, monthly Township Board meetings.

On behalf of the Township Board, we hope everybody has a happy and safe holiday season. Please take care of your families, friends, and neighbors.




