### Sugar Island Township News

As we know, unanticipated snow levels so far this year have led to enormous challenges. If you haven't prepared your homes and your vehicles for the really cold weather, please do so immediately. And while the snow has created a nuisance for some and a real hardship for many, the situation gets much worse if you lose the heat in your home. Please don't wait until it is too late.

Congratulations to the Sugar Island Youth Group for its wonderful Christmas program. The children involved seemed to enjoy themselves as did the friends and relatives watching the performances. We are glad to see that the famous big guy in red made a timely visit. Thank you to everybody that volunteered to make the program a success.

The St. Mary's River Keepers, a Harbor Safety Committee has announced that it is close to signing a 25-year lease with the Corps of Engineers for the property locally known as Island #1. This is the small island located on the south side of 1 ½ Mile Road between the ferry dock and the causeway. This space will be used to create a non-motorized trail system, a small, non-motorized watercraft launching site, and a picnic area. The trails will be used for hiking, birdwatching, skiing, and similar activities. The Island is a historic part of a Corps project which limits the types of activities that may take place there. For example, hunting and trapping are prohibited activities and so is overnight camping. Appropriate signage will be posted in the spring.

As you may know, the Sugar Island Lion's Club purchased beautiful new metal tables for the North Westshore Park pavilion. During the December Board Meeting, the Township turned over disposition of the old, wooden picnic tables from the North Westshore Park to the Lion's Club. If you are interested in purchasing one of these tables, please contact the leadership of the Lion's Club.

And finally, the Township Board will be conducting a Special Meeting starting at noon on Saturday, January 18, 2025, for the purposes of creating a document that reflects the duties and responsibilities of elected Township Board members. As you might imagine, some duties are legislatively mandated, but most are not. The Board will work to identify tasks, assign supervisory responsibilities, and address any procedural issues or hurdles. All work done during this session will be recorded and then approved at the regularly scheduled February Board meeting.

It is very important that you review your tax bill to be positive you are receiving a PRE exemption, if you qualify. This was formally known as "Homestead Exemption". It is located on the bottom half of the left side of you tax bill. If you qualify, it should read 100% in the PRE box. 
