

FIRE PLUGS

We had a call on the first day of spring which

coincided with the final winter storm of the year, we hope. With the call coming shortly before 6am, the roads were not all plowed and our driveways certainly weren't. When our first people responding saw the problem that could arise, we called Soo Township for mutual aid. About that time the power went out. Fortunately, the generator kicked in but, unfortunately the ice that slid off the roof had damaged the switch for the fire hall and our guys had to get ready in the dark. They overcame this but our mutual aid from Soo Township was on the ferry and the dock on the island side do not work without power. After several attempts to get off the boat the ferry crew came up with a plan - 'take a run at it'. It worked and they arrived in time to assist the island department. In the end all turned out well, no injuries and only minor damage. By the time we were cleaning up the snow had stopped and we actually had sunshine and electricity. Our thanks to Soo Township Fire and the ferry crew. In my next article we'll probably complain about the heat and dry weather. While thanking people let's not forget everyone who turned out for our ice rescue training. We had the Sherif's Department and the Coast Guard with their hovercraft and air boat and members from Sault Fire and other departments. And we have to thank the Lions for the food and beverages. As usual we had a good time and as always, we learned different ways that the same problem can be approached. Remember we will be in wildfire season at some point so now would be a good time to plan on making your home fire safe. Remove dead grass and brush from around your home. Find your hose and shovel and rake and shovel and never hesitate to call the fire department with any sign of trouble.

Sugar Island Township News

As we know, the calendar tells us that Spring is here. As the weather changes, and the snow melts, we need to be careful as that moisture will freeze causing ice, both in your driveways and area roads. Black ice is a real problem, especially since you may not see it until it is too late. Please be careful.

In our haste to move past this winter, please take the necessary steps to prepare your snow removal equipment before you put it away. This preparation won't eliminate the challenges you might experience next fall when trying to start your equipment after it sat dormant all summer, but it might limit the damage. Simply put, you should not forget to prepare the equipment before you put it away.

The Township will be closing out the 2024-2025 fiscal year on March 31st. The Board will approve a new budget at the Special Meeting held on March 25, 2025. The budget looks a lot like the previous budget with a few notable exceptions. We continue to adjust to the new emergency medical service agreement with Soo Fire and the ongoing challenges with solid waste.

Regarding solid waste, residents should be aware that the Bay Mills Indian Community (BMIC) has received a grant to dispose of used rubber tires. Anybody looking to dispose of used tires should contact them to receive a voucher. They are available at wastecollection@baymills.org or call (906) 248-8655, until funds run out. This program is for individual families, not businesses.

As a reminder, Sugar Island Township contracts with GFL for solid waste services. Our compactor service is available year-round at the North Transfer Station on 1 ½ Mile Road. The South Transfer Station also provides a compactor service on Homestead Road from May to October. We pay GFL based on the weight of material in the compactor. That means every piece of trash that goes in the compactor costs us. That includes all the glass, plastic, cardboard, and metal cans that could be recycled. Items that go into the recycling trailer do not cost us anything. We could save tons of money (pun intended) if we use the recycling trailer to dispose of glass, plastics, cardboard and metal cans. Plus, please don't put any kind of liquid in the compactor.

And finally, the Township will be discussing the millages for solid waste, ambulance and fire departments which expired this year. Taxpayers with an opinion about these programs should contact your Township Board members. These millages will require a public vote later this year if these programs are to be continued.

Bay Mills Indian Community will be holding <u>free</u> household hazardous waste collection events this spring. BMIC has contracted with ERG Environmental Services and they are trained to handle spills that may occur related to these events.

Participants will be required to sign up for a time slot as they are planning for 10 cars every 15 minutes to roll through the event. Each event is on a weekday from 2pm – 6pm.

Time slots will be available to be reserved in April-May 2025 to drop off household hazardous waste for free.

Our first meeting for this year will be held at 1pm, Wednesday, April 16, 2025, at S.I.C.C.




